Application Scoring Guide for Disciplines

Program Budget - Due to significant changes made by MAC to the matching requirements and request in FY26, the budget SHOULD NOT be considered when reviewing the application.

Application Scoring Guide: Consider which rubric score/description predominantly fits the proposed project. It doesn't have to fully match. Scores less than six should reflect an application criterion that does not achieve an acceptable level. Applicants with a total average score of less than six are not funded and may not apply for other funding with the same program in that fiscal year.

Artistic Quality Criterion (50%)

The project presents works of art with quality in design and skill in execution.

- The applicant describes the selection process, including selection criteria.
- The application includes biographic summaries of the key artistic and technical participants.
- The project utilizes original and unique works of art in program concept, design and presentation or the project encourages traditional artistic activities.
- The project broadens the artistic scope of the state's cultural activities.

Community Involvement Criterion (30%)

The applicant understands the community needs and involves the community in the project.

Community need for the project is determined by:

- Need for the applicant's arts
- Contribution to the cultural education of the community
- Accessibility of the project to the public (location, accessibility, cost)

Community support of the project is evidenced by:

- Financial, in-kind, volunteer, or government support
- Involvement of local artists
- Size and range of audiences

The project reflects sound practices in the planning, financing, staff and volunteer management.

- Experience of administrative staff, paid or volunteer
- Financial stability based on financial reports
- Clarity and completeness of the application
